Bonnie Latta of TVA's TVA Innovation and Research provided a briefing about TVA's new program, TVA Connect Communities Project

What are the goals of TVA's Connect Communities Project?

It connects disparate groups by

listening to and working with local people. It brings people together to tackle the issues they face. It involves residents, the workforce, businesses, organizations, and institutions. When these players connect, communities start to thrive.

What are the benefits of connected communities?

Social Connection Improves Health. People living in socially connected communities are more likely to thrive because they feel safe and welcome and trust each other. Trusting, meaningful relationships enhance our mental, physical, and emotional health and well-being.

What is the purpose of community connections?

Social interactions and connections contribute to improved mental and emotional health, promoting a sense of belonging and purpose. Sense of Belonging: Being part of a community gives individuals a sense of identity and belonging.

What makes a connected community?

The connected community uses high speed broadband to connect its citizens, businesses and local government to the education, tools and resources that will help them thrive in today's digital world.

TVA Funds Six Connected Communities Pilot Projects to Lower Energy Costs, Support STEM and Workforce Development.

Six pilot projects located across the region were selected for up to \$2 million in TVA funding to help communities transition to a cleaner economy. Connected Communities is one of several TVA initiatives designed to help achieve net-zero carbon emissions by 2050.

Jennifer Johnson of BVI discussed the new BVI approval process. Jennifer provided an handout describing the guidelines for chapters to request funding. Chapters should work with Penny Walker in requesting funding. She stated that 150 TVA retirees are working on FEMA projects. In addition, 400 retirees are working on TVA jobs.


Liberty Phillips of TVA's Retiree Communication requested that the chapters work with her in developing a schedule for her visit to all chapters. She requested retirees attend a community meeting such as the meeting in Muscle Shoals on September 5, 2024. At these meetings and the TVA retiree picnic, TVA will provide coolers.

Mark Meigs, Executive Secretary of the TVA Retirement System, reported on the status of the TVA Retirement System. He expects the system will be fully funded by the end of the decade. The contribution of TVA of \$300 M has accelerated the achievement of that goal.

The TVA Retirement System (TVARS) administers retirement benefits for approximately 10,600 employees and 22,000 retirees and beneficiaries

- TVARS pension assets total \$8.4 billion
- TVARS funded status of 86% (estimated)
- Annual pension benefit payments are projected to total \$760 million
- TVA contributes a minimum of \$300 million annually to TVARS to fund pension benefits for a period of 20 years (FY17 to FY36) or until TVARS reaches 100% funded status, if earlier
- TVARS continues to de-risk the pension plan
 - De-risking provides greater stability in asset values while working toward goal of fully funding the liabilities by 2036 with emphasis on downside protection
 - Current asset allocation is 59% fixed income, 21% equities and 20% inflation sensitive assets

There are less than 200 employees on the original pension plan. He reassured retirees that the Retirement System is healthy and there is no reason to worry.



Sadie Smith of TVA's Benefits Staff stated the Via Benefits is performing better in serving retirees requesting information about their request for information about Medigap Supplement Insurance. There will be Webinar workshop scheduled this fall to inform retirees how to work through identifying the best health care.

JoAnne Lavender, Valley Wide President, reported that 456 retirees and guests have signed up for the TVA sponsored picnic on September 12, 2024, in Chattanooga.

Vickie Ellis, past President reported discussed a need for a strategic plan for the association to look into the future.

Newsweek has named TVA Community Credit Union among 2024's America's Best Regional Banks and Credit Unions. Best Essay Winner: Mollie Smith (Raybron Leon Smith)

As a high school student, you do not often sit in history class and think about how historical events impact your life. But in my 10th grade American history class I did. We were learning about life after the Great Depression and President Roosevelt's idea for relief and recovery. The New Deal programs had the goal of providing relief, recovery, or reform for the nation or a specific area. The Tennessee Valley Authority was introduced by President Roosevelt with the goal of providing recovery for the Tennessee Valley. TVA is one out of seven New Deal programs still in effect today under its original name. According to historians, there was such a feeling of excitement in the Tennessee Valley when FDR traveled through towns explaining the prosperity that was to come from this program. When learning about this in 10th grade I immediately knew and understood the lifelong impact it had on society as a whole. TVA was created with the goal of providing recovery and jobs to the Tennessee Valley. It achieved the goal of flood better navigation and protection allowing for to the surrounding areas. With TVA being around and active for almost 90 years it has impacted my family in very positive ways. It provided job security and increased stability for both my grandfather, Raybron Leon Smith Jr., and my father, Micah Leon Smith. This allowed for my family to live comfortably and give my father a way to provide for us. Both of these men in my life have demonstrated what it means to 'never work a day in your life'. My grandfather took and my father takes great pride in what they do and never considered it a chore to go to work. They were passionate about what they do and that is a trait I know they both instilled in me.

On a wider scale TVA still provides electricity and jobs for so many. Even as technology has advanced in the last 90 years, TVA continues to evolve with the times to continue to fulfill all of the world's needs. TVA awarded a grant this past year for the STEM programs in high schools. Florence High School was

one of the schools in Alabama that received this funding. This allowed for students, like myself, to learn and be educated in a way that students at other schools cannot. The STEM program at my school allowed for students to have hands-on experiences with real world situations. The students in schools that do not have funding may have to just sit in a classroom all day and be lectured and never set foot in a science lab. With the funding from TVA, students at Florence High School are able to experience time in the lab at least every 2 weeks! This gives students at FHS a tremendous advantage above other schools in our nation. Now being a freshman in college this funding from TVA is still benefiting me. Taking a biology lab can be a challenge, but due to the time I got in my lab senior year of high school I was already ahead of my classmates. The challenges my peers faced were easier for me to overcome. I would not have had experience had TVA not funded my high school's positive STEM It may not be clear to many but for me it is easy to see how TVA has impacted my life and our nation. I appreciate the opportunity to be able to apply for this scholarship. I assure you that I would be a good representative of both TVA and UNA, if chosen.
